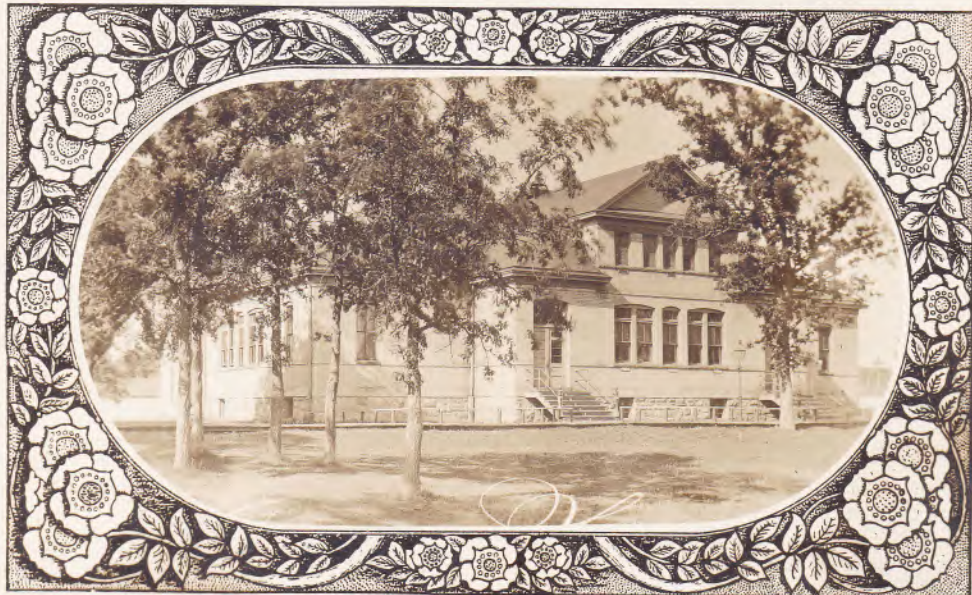

For and in consideration of the United States assuming the care, education, and maintenance in the United States Indian School at Carlisle Pa., of Chas. Kennedy, Male, I, Elizabeth Dale (Aunt) of H. Barber Auburn P. O., State of New York, do hereby voluntarily consent and agree to Charles enrollment in said school for a period of 9 years, and also obligate and bind myself to abide by all the rules and regulations for Indian schools.

I further say that the said child was born at Onondaga Res on 15th April, 1887 that the father, Daniel Kennedy (Dead), was a 3/4 Indian of the Oneida Tribe located at Oneida Res Agency; that he left the tribe about Some time before 1886 and died on Onondaga Agency that the mother, Mary Kennedy (Dead), was a full Indian of the Onondaga Tribe located at Onondaga Agency, and left the tribe about never left died on Agency; that the said child was born and reared in the United States, and now actually resides therein; and that he has attended the following schools:

INDORSEMENT.

A child showing one-sixteenth or less Indian blood, whose parents live on an Indian reservation, Indian fashion, who, if debarred from the Government schools, could not obtain an education, may be permitted in the reservation day and boarding schools, but it is preferable that it be not transferred to a nonreservation school, without permission from the Office. Children showing one-eighth or less Indian blood, whose parents do not live on an Indian reservation, whose home is among white people where there are churches and schools, who are presumed to have adopted the white man's manners and customs, and are to all intents and purposes white people, are debarred from enrollment in the Government nonreservation and reservation schools. Superintendents, in all cases where doubt exists as to the degree of Indian blood of a child proposed for transfer, should fully satisfy themselves of the facts by affidavits from reliable persons, which affidavits must be kept on file at the school.

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other non-reservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

A pupil dismissed from school for cause must not be enrolled in any other school without the permission of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs. Full facts must be submitted with each request.

Sad Death of Former Student.

Mr. Chas. W. Kennedy, formerly disciplinarian and band teacher at the White Earth School, was burned to death in a gasoline explosion at his home at Mahnomen on Monday, October 6th.

It appears that Mr. Kennedy attempted to start a fire with what he supposed was kerosene oil, but was in reality gasoline.

Mr. Kennedy was a graduate of Carlisle and a young man of considerable ability. He was a conscientious employee and respected by all who knew him. He leaves a widow and two small children, who will have the sympathy of all relatives and friends.
