MRS. LOUIS CHINGWA

DIED SATURDAY AFTER

ILLNESS OF TWO WEEKS.

Mrs. Louis Chingwa, wife of one of Petoskey's best known Indian residents, who has been critically ill for about two weeks, died Saturday evening in this city. She contracted pneumonia a short time ago and, being weak from constantly nursing a child which also had the disease, she grew rapidly worse.

About a week ago a baby girl was born, which died a day later, and from that time Mrs. Chingwa failed very noticeably until the end came. She is survived by her husband and one child. She was one of the most respected Indian women of the region and had a large number of friends among the best circles of her own people and of the white residents of this section.

The sincere sympathy of these as well as of the members of the fraternal league of which he was the umpire, are extended to the young husband in his sorrow. The funeral is to be held at 9 o'clock Tuesday morning from St. Francis church and interment will be made in Greenwood.
