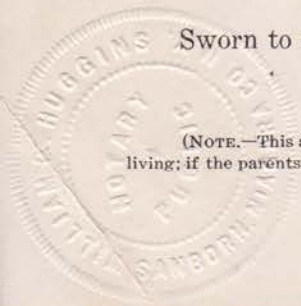

# GIRL'S NECK IS SNAPPED

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Miss Greene of Sanborn Instantly  
Killed in Auto Accident at  
Niagara Falls.

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## CARRIAGE WAS HIT

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Occupants Were Not Injured.  
Driver of the Automobile  
is Slightly Hurt.

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## CLOSE CALL FOR CHILD

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Drove a Crochet Needle Under His  
Eye, but Fortunately Missed  
the Brain.

Niagara Falls, Nov. 25.—Miss Mary J. Greene, 21 years old, of Sanborn was instantly killed and John Thorpe, 28 years old, also of Sanborn, was injured, when a light automobile in which they were riding ran into the rear of a carriage in the Saunders settlement road half a mile from the city line, shortly before 6 o'clock tonight. Allan Sworm of No. 918 Cleveland avenue and his aunt, Mrs. Ellen Voelker of No. 820 Willom avenue, were in the carriage. Aside from a few bruises they were uninjured.

The Sanborn young man and woman were coming to the Falls to attend a Thanksgiving party. As they rounded a curve, they saw a carriage ahead, but too late to avert a rear-end collision. Miss Greene's neck was broken. Thorpe has two broken ribs and internal injuries.

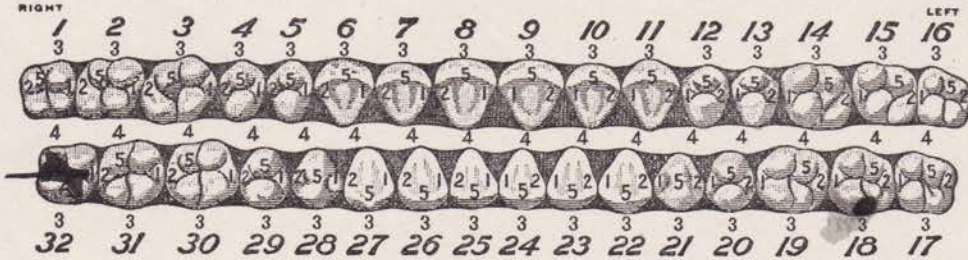
