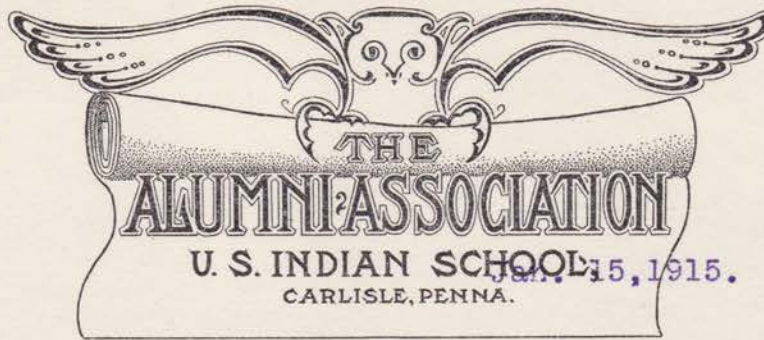

I would thank you to give this request your prompt attention so that our school literature can be mailed to those whose names you suggest at the earliest possible date.

It is desired that you list the names of those whose periods of enrolment at other schools terminate this year, as well as those who have not yet reached the age of twenty-one and who have not been in school this year. Here at Carlisle we are equipped to fit young men and women for useful work regardless of the lack of previous training in academic studies or vocational activities, and there is ample room to accomodate a great many students in each department.

Hoping that your co-operation in this matter will be extended, and that, by your help, the splendid opportunities you had here can be brought to the attention of the many young people who should be in school at the opening of the new school year in September, I am, with best wishes,
