

TWENTY-THREE years of work, such as is done at the Carlisle Indian School, must tell for good upon the people who come into contact with it.

The "Carlisle Idea" has become such a wide-spread influence, that the Indian as he came to the School in its early days, is a thing of the past.

The blanket Indian is falling to the rear, and the tidy, well-dressed, self-supporting Indian is taking his place.

Historic ground was chosen for the work that is here making history each new day.

When, in 1777, the native Indian saw Hessian prisoners build the barracks, of which only the old Guard House now remains, who could foresee that a century and a half later the children of the red man should here be trained in the peaceful arts.

Future generations will turn with just pride to the work of this institution, and bear grateful tribute to the far-seeing wisdom and wise guidance of its efficient head.
