To Superintendents and Officers in Charge:

There is transmitted herewith Departmental Authority No. 40,000, authorizing the establishment of all positions under your jurisdiction for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1919, this list to be effective July 1, 1918.

Owing to the steady advance in prices, the amounts required for annual estimate and other supplies have been materially increased and as a result a number of positions throughout the entire Service have been abolished. Immediately upon receipt of your new salary list, therefore, you should go over same carefully, noting all changes by reason of abolishment of position, change in designation, change in fund, etc., to avoid exceptions being taken to your accounts.

Unless you find it absolutely necessary to do otherwise, all temporary employees under your jurisdiction should be relieved by you on or prior to June 30, such reliefs, as well as all other changes, to be reported to the Office on your regular Reports of Changes in Employees for the months of June and July. If, however, conditions require the continuance of certain temporaries beyond June 30, such employees should be considered as in continuous service, their reliefs on June 30 and their re-entrance on duty July 1 NOT TO BE REPORTED TO THE OFFICE, their final reliefs being sufficient; no person, however, to be so continued by you temporarily or otherwise where the position has not been previously authorized.

Instructions will be issued later regarding the application of such increased compensation as Congress may authorize.

You are requested to acknowledge immediately, by letter, the receipt of this circular and enclosures.
